## Tech Cues Mock Up (Due March 10)

Tech Notes Need to be Precise, And have Specific Cues. IE, don't put 'Line 5, Lights down', put 'Line 5 "I wish you were dead" Sudden Blackout.' Use specific terms, there is a difference between a Blackout (*True Darkness, usually Quick*), a Slow Fade (*Fades to Black over 3-5 Seconds*), and a Blue Out (*Work Lights for Set Changes*) Or Black-to-Blue (*Fades to Black but then Blue Lights slowly rise up*). You can also 'Choreograph' Tech Cues, IE "Lights fade up Slowly SL, but over 30 Seconds Lights Rise SR. Once Both Sides are Lit SL Shifts to Red Light as SR Shifts to Blue Lights."
